### SUMMARY

#### Synopsis of Bill

House Bill 103 amends Section 66-3-424.24 to provide that a parent, spouse, child or sibling of a service member killed in an armed conflict is eligible for a gold star family license plate.

### FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

The bill provides that an additional fee of \$10 will be collected for the original issuance of the special plate. The fees will be kept by the department to defray the cost of making and issuing the special plate.

### ADMINISTRATIVE IMPLICATIONS

Implementation of this bill will have a low impact on the Information Technology Division and will take about four weeks to implement.
