SUMMARY

Synopsis of Memorial

House Memorial 97 requests the Office of the State Medical Investigator (OMI) to work with the Grief Resource Center and others to develop a financial and care proposal that includes criteria necessary to meet the grief counseling needs of New Mexico communities.

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

OMI is likely to incur limited costs in terms of staff time in carrying out the provisions of the memorial.

OMI receives about \$4.7 million in annual recurring general fund appropriations. HAFCS/HB 2 & 3 includes an increase of \$500 thousand for OMI in FY19.

SIGNIFICANT ISSUES

According to OMI's website, OMI currently offers the Grief Services Program (GSP) at no cost

to participants. These services provided by master's level mental health professionals include:

- Individual and family counseling therapy;
- Crisis intervention services, including telephone consultation, home visits, and meetings with families at OMI;
- Referrals to appropriate community resources;
- Support group facilitation;
- Advocacy; and
- Facilitation of meetings with pathologists or investigators and family members to review autopsy reports.

OMI's website further indicates the office provides grief education and training throughout New Mexico for agencies such as law enforcement, emergency responders, nurses, mental health providers, teachers, and other groups requesting training.
