## **SUMMARY**

## Synopsis of Bill

Senate Bill 92 appropriates \$500 thousand from the general fund to ALTSD to fund nutritional programming at senior centers statewide that provide fresh produce grown by New Mexico farmers to indigent seniors.

#### FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

The appropriation of \$500 thousand contained in this bill is a recurring expense to the general fund. Any unexpended or unencumbered balance remaining at the end of FY19 shall revert to the general fund.

ALTSD said they would distribute this funding to senior centers through its network of area agencies, which would require staff time and management of contract amendments and reconciliation of this funding. The food items distributed would provide additional nutrition for the indigent seniors receiving them. Many senior centers are already engaged in food distribution through collaborative efforts with local food banks.
