A MEMORIAL

RECOGNIZING JAMES "JIM" JACKSON FOR HIS TIRELESS WORK OVER THIRTY-EIGHT YEARS IN PROMOTING THE RIGHTS OF PERSONS WITH DISABILITIES AND FOR HAVING ESTABLISHED AND GROWN DISABILITY RIGHTS NEW MEXICO.

WHEREAS, James "Jim" Jackson was hired in October 1979 to establish and manage the nonprofit organization that is known today as disability rights New Mexico, and has served as executive director and now chief executive officer from that time through the present day; and

WHEREAS, disability rights New Mexico is the state's designated protection and advocacy system, charged by federal law with promoting and protecting the rights of persons with disabilities, serving persons with a broad range of disabilities and assisting individuals in accessing needed

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1 services and overcoming discrimination; and

2 WHEREAS, Jim Jackson has been a member of numerous state  
3 advisory groups and task forces and currently serves as a  
4 member of the developmental disabilities planning council and  
5 the medicaid advisory committee and as the chair of the  
6 steering committee for the disability coalition; and

7 WHEREAS, through its advocacy efforts, disability rights  
8 New Mexico has had an impact on transforming the state's system  
9 for providing services to persons with developmental  
10 disabilities from an institutional model to a person-centered,  
11 community-based service model; establishing a national  
12 precedent for the authority of protection and advocacy agencies  
13 to visit with residents of facilities and programs; recognizing  
14 the fair housing rights of persons with disabilities; requiring  
15 accommodations for persons with disabilities seeking to comment  
16 on proposed state rules; and other legal precedents; and

17 WHEREAS, Jim Jackson has provided information and  
18 assistance to legislators concerning disability-related issues  
19 for more than thirty-eight years, including legislation  
20 requiring educational services for preschool-aged children with  
21 disabilities; requiring the state to establish the  
22 developmental disabilities waiver program; requiring the state  
23 to participate in the federal special education grant program;  
24 establishing services for persons with brain injuries and  
25 persons with autism; allowing for mental health advance

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1 directives; and prohibiting corporal punishment and the use of  
2 seclusion and restraints in public schools; and

3 WHEREAS, disability rights New Mexico was able to purchase  
4 a building in July 2016 to serve as its main office, and that  
5 building was dedicated last year by the board of directors of  
6 disability rights New Mexico as the James Jackson center for  
7 disability rights; and

8 WHEREAS, Jim Jackson will be retiring as the chief  
9 executive officer of disability rights New Mexico as of March  
10 31, 2018 but will continue his public policy advocacy in the  
11 coming year as a lobbyist for disability rights New Mexico;

12 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF  
13 REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO that James "Jim"  
14 Jackson be recognized for his tireless work over thirty-eight  
15 years in promoting the rights of persons with disabilities; and

16 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that Jim Jackson be recognized for  
17 having established and developed disability rights New Mexico,  
18 under its current and former name, New Mexico protection and  
19 advocacy system, as an important organization that advocates  
20 for as well as educates policymakers and the public on the  
21 rights of persons with disabilities; and

22 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that copies of this memorial be  
23 transmitted to Jim Jackson and to the board of directors of  
24 disability rights New Mexico.

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
