AN ACT

RELATING TO GOVERNMENTAL CONDUCT; PROHIBITING DISCLOSURE OF SENSITIVE PERSONAL INFORMATION BY STATE AGENCY EMPLOYEES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:

SECTION 1. A new section of the Governmental Conduct Act is enacted to read:

"[<u>NEW MATERIAL</u>] SENSITIVE PERSONAL INFORMATION.--

A. A state agency employee shall not disclose sensitive personal information acquired by virtue of the employee's position with a state agency to anyone outside the

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state agency except when such disclosure is:

 necessary to carry out a function of the state agency;

(2) necessary to comply with an order of a court of this state or of the United States;

(3) required by a subpoena;

B. As used in this section, "sensitive personal information" means a person's:

(1) status as a recipient of public assistance;

(2) status as a victim of a serious violentoffense as defined in Section 33-2-34 NMSA 1978;

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(3) sexual orientation, gender identity, physical or mental disability, immigration status, national origin or religion; and

(4) social security number or individual tax identification number."

SECTION 2. EFFECTIVE DATE.--The effective date of the provisions of this act is July 1, 2019.

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
