#### **BILL SUMMARY**

#### Synopsis of Bill

House Bill 420 (HB420) would require each public postsecondary institution to accept a score of three or higher on College Board Advanced Placement (AP) examinations for postsecondary credit, unless the chief academic officer at the institution provides evidence that a higher score is necessary for a student to be successful in a subsequent course. The Higher Education Department (HED) would be required to collect and report the AP acceptance policy from each institution to determine the credits earned from AP exams and would be required to file a report including findings and recommendations to the Legislature and the governor.

#### FISCAL IMPACT

HB420 does not contain an appropriation.

### **SUBSTANTIVE ISSUES**

HB420 would establish a statutory statewide AP policy beginning with the 2019-2020 school year. Institutions of higher education would be required to accept a score of three or higher on AP exams as credit for a corresponding course. If the institution does not have a corresponding course, the institution would be required to count the AP exam as an elective course credit.

HB420 would not substantially alter an August 2018 HED policy establishing statewide course equivalencies for AP exam scores of three or higher. See Attachment, *HED Advanced Placement Exam Scores and Statewide Course Equivalencies*. According to the policy, an AP exam score of three generates credit for an entry-level course, while scores of four and five may generate credit for higher level courses. For example, an AP Computer Science exam score of three currently counts as credit for "Computer Science I," while a score of four or five counts as credit toward "Object-Oriented Programming." Prior to this policy, each institution set their own course equivalencies.

#### ADMINISTRATIVE IMPLICATIONS

Institutions of higher education would be required to provide course-granting methodology to HED, including evidence-based research if the institution chooses to require an AP exam score greater than three for course credit.

HED would be required to assemble course-granting policies from each institution of higher education and publish findings and recommendations in a report to the Legislature and the governor.

#### OTHER SIGNIFICANT ISSUES

HB420 substantively duplicates SB208 from the 2017 session, which passed unanimously in the House and Senate but was pocket vetoed.

New Mexico students attempted over 17 thousand AP exams in the 2017-2018 school year and 6,808 exams were successfully completed with a score of three or higher, with an average pass rate of 39.4 percent. As is the case with other academic achievement data in New Mexico, AP exam scores and pass rates show a large achievement gap along demographic and socioeconomic lines. Additionally, fewer AP exams were attempted in the 2017-2018 school year than in the previous year.
