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16	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:
17	SECTION 1. Section 9-25-1 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 2005,
18	Chapter 289, Section 1) is amended to read:
19	"9-25-1. SHORT TITLE[Sections 1 through 13 of this
20	act] <u>Chapter 9, Article 25 NMSA 1978</u> may be cited as the
21	"Higher Education Department Act"."
22	SECTION 2. Section 9-25-3 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 2005,
23	Chapter 289, Section 3) is amended to read:
24	"9-25-3. DEFINITIONSAs used in the Higher Education
25	Department Act:
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1 "[board] council" means the higher education Α. 2 [advisory board] coordinating council; "department" means the higher education 3 Β. department; and 4 "secretary" means the secretary of higher 5 C. education." 6 7 SECTION 3. Section 9-25-10 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 2005, Chapter 289, Section 10) is amended to read: 8 9 "9-25-10. HIGHER EDUCATION [ADVISORY BOARD] COORDINATING COUNCIL--MEMBERSHIP--TERMS--ADMINISTRATIVE ATTACHMENT--10 PURPOSE . --11 12 The "higher education [advisory board] Α. 13 coordinating council" is created to advise the department and 14 the governor on higher education policy matters, coordinate the development and implementation of the statewide higher 15 education strategic plan and attendant policies and goals and 16 perform other functions as provided by law. The [board] 17 18 council is administratively attached to the department, with 19 administrative staff provided by the department. 20 [B. The secretary shall appoint fourteen members giving due regard to geographic representation, cultural 21 diversity and the composition of higher education institutions 22 in New Mexico. Four members shall represent the four-year 23 public post-secondary educational institutions, one of whom 24 shall represent the university of New Mexico, one of whom shall 25 .211897.1

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1	represent New Mexico state university, one of whom shall
2	represent New Mexico institute of mining and technology and one
3	of whom shall represent either New Mexico highlands university,
4	eastern New Mexico university or western New Mexico university;
5	three members shall represent the two-year public post-
6	secondary educational institutions; one member shall represent
7	the accredited private post-secondary educational institutions;
8	one member shall represent business; one member shall represent
9	college and university faculty; one member shall represent
10	college and university nonfaculty staff; one member shall be a
11	college or university student; one representative of the tribal
12	colleges in New Mexico; and one representative of the Indian
13	nations, tribes and pueblos in New Mexico. The members
14	representing the categories of post-secondary educational
15	institutions shall be the chief executive officers of the
16	institutions of those categories or the chief executive
17	officers' designees. The members representing faculty and
18	nonfaculty staff and the student member shall be the leaders of
19	faculty, staff and student organizations at their respective
20	institutions.]
21	B. The council shall consist of the following
22	members:
23	(1) the secretary of higher education, who
24	shall serve as the chairperson;

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(2) the chief executive officer of a state

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1	university or the officer's designee, rotating among the state
2	universities every four years, appointed by the council of
3	university presidents;
4	(3) the chief executive officer of a state
5	branch community college or the officer's designee, rotating
6	among the state branch community colleges every two years,
7	appointed by the association of community colleges;
8	(4) the chief executive officer of a public
9	independent community college or the officer's designee,
10	rotating among the public independent community colleges every
11	three years, appointed by the governor on the recommendation of
12	the New Mexico association of independent community colleges;
13	(5) the chief financial officer of a state
14	university or the officer's designee, rotating among the
15	universities every two years, appointed by the council of
16	university presidents;
17	(6) the chief financial officer of a public
18	independent community college or the officer's designee,
19	rotating among the public independent community colleges every
20	four years, appointed by the governor on the recommendation of
21	the association of independent community colleges;
22	(7) the chief executive officer of a tribal
23	college or branch campus located in New Mexico or the officer's
24	designee, rotating among the tribal colleges or branches every
25	two years, appointed by the governor;
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1 the following ex-officio members or their (8) 2 designees: (a) the secretary of public education; 3 (b) the secretary of workforce 4 solutions; and 5 (c) the secretary of economic 6 7 development; and (9) three public members with expertise in 8 business or finance, appointed by the governor, one for an 9 initial term of four years, one for an initial term of three 10 years and one for an initial term of two years; thereafter, 11 12 terms shall be for four years and public members may be reappointed at the end of their terms. 13 [Four members of the initial board, including 14 C. the student member, shall be appointed for two years, five 15 members shall be appointed for three years and five members 16 shall be appointed for four years; thereafter, the student 17 member shall serve a two-year term and the other members shall 18 19 serve four-year terms.] Public members are entitled to receive 20 per diem and mileage as provided in the Per Diem and Mileage Act and shall receive no other perquisite, compensation or 21 allowance. 22 D. The [board] council shall annually elect a 23 24

[chair] vice [chair] chairperson and secretary from among its membership. A majority of the members constitutes a quorum for .211897.1

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1 the conduct of business.

2	E. The [board] <u>council</u> shall meet at the call of
3	the chair at least quarterly. Meetings of the [board] <u>council</u>
4	shall be held in Santa Fe and at other sites within the state
5	at the direction of the [board] <u>council. The council is</u>
6	subject to the Open Meetings Act. Meetings shall be webcast,
7	recorded and archived.
8	F. The council shall:
9	(1) coordinate ongoing discussions and
10	analyses of:
11	<u>(a) ways to improve New Mexico's higher</u>
12	education system and the services provided to New Mexico
13	residents by each post-secondary educational institution in New
14	Mexico; and
15	(b) possibilities of improving
16	operational and financial efficiencies in the system; and
17	(2) with the department, develop and update a
18	statewide higher education strategic plan and monitor the
19	progress of the department and the institutions in meeting the
20	goals of the strategic plan."
21	SECTION 4. Section 9-25-13 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 2005,
22	Chapter 289, Section 13) is amended to read:
23	"9-25-13. ADVISORY COMMITTEES
24	A. [In addition to the higher education advisory
25	board] The department may create [other] advisory committees.
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"Advisory" means furnishing advice, gathering information, 2 making recommendations and performing such other activities as may be instructed or delegated and as may be necessary to 3 fulfill advisory functions or to comply with federal or private funding requirements and does not extend to administering a program or function or setting policy unless specified by law. Advisory committees shall be appointed in accordance with the provisions of the Executive Reorganization Act. 8

All members of advisory committees are entitled Β. to receive per diem and mileage as provided in the Per Diem and Mileage Act and shall receive no other compensation, perquisite or allowance."

SECTION 5. Section 21-1-21 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1971, Chapter 235, Section 4) is amended to read:

"21-1-21. CAPITAL EXPENDITURES. -- No expenditure shall be made by any state educational institution confirmed by Article 12, Section 11 of the [state] constitution of New Mexico for the purchase of real property or the construction of buildings or other major structures or for major remodeling projects without prior approval of the proposed purchase, [or] construction or remodeling by the [board of educational finance] higher education department and the [state board of finance] higher education coordinating council."

SECTION 6. Section 21-1-21.1 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 2001, Chapter 319, Section 22) is amended to read:

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"21-1-21.1. STATE EDUCATIONAL INSTITUTIONS--ADEQUATE PARKING.--The staff architect of a university, or the [commission on] higher education <u>department</u> in the case of state educational facilities that do not employ a staff architect, shall review all plans for the construction or major enlargement of a state educational facility prior to the execution of a contract for such work and shall certify to the [state board of finance] <u>higher education coordinating council</u> that adequate parking is provided for the use of staff employed in the facility, students who attend classes or events in the facility and members of the public reasonably expected to enter the facility. If adequate parking is not provided for, no contract may be entered into."

SECTION 7. Section 21-1-24 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1971, Chapter 235, Section 3) is amended to read:

"21-1-24. GRADUATE PROGRAMS.--None of the funds appropriated in the general [appropriations act] appropriation acts to the state educational institutions confirmed by Article 12, Section 11 of the [state] constitution of New Mexico may be used for the support of any program [or programs] of graduate study beyond the level of the bachelor's degree other than programs that were maintained by each institution previous to September 1, 1954, except by explicit approval of each program by the [board of educational finance] higher education department and the [state board of finance] higher education .211897.1

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1 coordinating council prior to [such] the use of the funds." 2 SECTION 8. Section 21-1-26.9 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1998, 3 Chapter 61, Section 2, as amended) is amended to read: "21-1-26.9. LIMITATION--HIGHER EDUCATION DEPARTMENT--4 5 REVIEW OF PROPOSED CAMPUSES .-- Effective January 1, 1998, no new public post-secondary educational institution, branch campus or 6 7 off-campus instructional center shall be created except as 8 specifically created by the legislature. The higher education 9 department and the higher education coordinating council shall review any proposal for the establishment of a new public post-10 secondary educational institution or campus and submit [its] 11 12 their recommendations to the legislature. In reviewing 13 proposals, the department and the council may consider: 14 Α. provisions for a local mill levy of at least two mills; 15 population base to provide at least five hundred 16 Β. bracketed material] = delete full-time students; 17 18 C. whether at least fifty percent of the costs of 19 initial construction comes from private or local sources; 20 D. governance structure; Ε. means for acquisition of property, including 21 purchase, lease, donations or any other means; 22 eligibility and level of funding request of the F. 23 state; and 24 G. brokering of extended learning provisions." 25 .211897.1 - 9 -

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1 SECTION 9. Section 21-1-26.12 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 2 2005, Chapter 289, Section 14) is amended to read: 3 "21-1-26.12. EDUCATIONAL NEEDS AND GUIDELINES--4 ACCOUNTABILITY REPORTS .--5 The higher education department shall, [through Α. 6 consultation] with the assistance of the higher education 7 coordinating council and all public post-secondary educational 8 institutions, develop and publish a statement of statewide 9 educational needs and guidelines to assist the institutions in 10 the development or modification of institutional strategic The department, with the assistance of the higher 11 plans. 12 education coordinating council, may conduct studies of statewide educational needs and make recommendations to the 13 14 governor, the legislature and public post-secondary educational institutions. 15 All public post-secondary educational 16 Β. 17 institutions, including off-campus instruction programs and 18 learning centers, shall: 19 (1)approve and submit accountability reports 20 prepared in accordance with the statewide public agenda; and submit budgets for review no later than 21 (2) August 1 each year for the following fiscal year." 22 SECTION 10. Section 21-2-3 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1973, 23 Chapter 233, Section 3, as amended) is amended to read: 24 25 "21-2-3. STATE COMMISSION CREATED--DESIGNATED MEMBERS--

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1 DESIGNATION OF SUPPLEMENTARY MEMBERS FOR SPECIFIC FUNCTIONS .--2 [There is created] The "state commission on post-secondary education" is created. 3 The [commission on] higher education coordinating council is designated the state commission and 4 shall work closely with the higher education department when 5 undertaking the commission duties. For the purposes of the 6 7 Post-Secondary Educational Planning Act, the [commission on higher education] council, in functioning as the state 8 9 commission, is charged with a concern for all types of postsecondary education and all types of educational institutions 10 and programs as enumerated in Section 21-2-2 NMSA 1978. 11 12 Whenever federal statutes and regulations so require, the state commission may request the governor to appoint, for specific 13 14 functions relating to federally sponsored programs, supplementary members to the state commission, and members 15 shall be appointed by the governor to fulfill those specific 16 functions as requested. When sitting with the state 17 commission, the supplementary members shall have, for purposes 18 of the specific functions for which they were appointed, all 19 20 the powers and perquisites of regular members of the state commission." 21

SECTION 11. Section 21-2-5.1 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1988, Chapter 164, Section 1, as amended) is amended to read: "21-2-5.1. FUNDING FORMULA.--

A. The [commission on] higher education <u>department</u> .211897.1

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1 shall develop a funding formula that will provide funding for 2 each institution of higher education to accomplish its mission as determined by [a] <u>the</u> statewide plan. 3 The [commission on] higher education department 4 Β. may include factors in the funding formula, which when 5 implemented will achieve the following: 6 7 (1) improve the quality of programs central to each institution's mission: 8 9 (2) develop and enhance programs that meet targeted post-secondary educational needs and the related needs 10 of public schools; 11 12 (3) eliminate unnecessary, unproductive or duplicative programs; 13 consider faculty salaries and benefits 14 (4) adjustment to a competitive level with similar institutions in 15 similar states, when such compensation adjustments are 16 supported by detailed analyses of faculty workloads and 17 educational outcomes assessments, and nonteaching staff 18 salaries and benefits at a competitive level with other similar 19 20 public or private sector employment in the community in which the institution is situated; 21 recognize additional costs incurred (5) 22 through increases in enrollment; 23 (6) provide for equipment and equipment 24 maintenance and library acquisitions and operations since the 25 .211897.1

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1 development of the prior funding formula; 2 fund off-campus courses and other (7) 3 nontraditional course delivery systems at a level sufficient to allow their development; 4 5 (8) provide incentives to institutions to pursue private or alternative funding sources; 6 7 (9) encourage the sharing of expertise, equipment and facilities and development of joint instructional 8 9 programs, research and public service projects; implement uniform articulation agreements 10 (10)and facilitation of transfer of students between institutions; 11 12 (11) encourage energy conservation; require mechanisms to track expenditures (12)13 14 to ensure greater accountability; and require each institution of higher (13) 15 education that offers distance learning and computer-based 16 courses of study to provide accompanying electronic formats 17 that are usable by an individual with a disability using 18 assistive technology, and those formats shall be based on the 19 20 American standard code for information interchange, hypertext markup language and extensible markup language." 21 SECTION 12. 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1 The state commission in carrying out its Α. planning activities for post-secondary education shall consult 2 with and invite the active participation of: 3 (1) the department; 4 [(1)] (2) representatives of post-secondary 5 educational institutions of the several types enumerated in 6 7 Paragraph (2) of Subsection A of Section 21-2-2 NMSA 1978; [(2)] <u>(3)</u> the public education commission; 8 9 [(3)] (4) the public education department; [(4)] (5) representatives of public and 10 private elementary and secondary schools; 11 12 [(5)] (6) the [secretary of labor] workforce solutions department; 13 14 [(6)] (7) the tourism department; [(7)] (8) the apprenticeship council; 15 [(8)] (9) the economic development department; 16 [(9)] (10) the state advisory council on 17 vocational education; 18 (10) the secretary of finance and 19 20 administration or the secretary's designee;] (11) persons familiar with the education needs 21 of persons with a disability and persons disadvantaged by 22 economic, racial or ethnic status; 23 (12) representatives of business, industry, 24 organized labor and agriculture; 25 .211897.1 - 14 -

Whenever the planning activities carried out 4 under the provisions of Section 21-2-5 NMSA 1978 are concerned 5 with the types of post-secondary education enumerated in 6 7 Subparagraphs (a) through (e) of Paragraph (1) of Subsection A of Section 21-2-2 NMSA 1978, the state commission shall 8 9 directly involve the public education commission and the public education department in all planning activities." 10 SECTION 13. Section 21-2-7 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1973, 11 12 Chapter 233, Section 7) is amended to read: "21-2-7. ANNUAL REPORT.--The state commission shall 13 14 submit an annual report to the governor and the legislature prior to November 15 each year. [Such] The report shall 15 describe the planning activities undertaken, present data on 16 the status of all types of post-secondary education and set 17 18 forth all recommendations developed under Subsections I, J and 19 K of Section [5, Items I, J and K of the Post-Secondary 20 Educational Planning Act] 21-2-5 NMSA 1978. Prior to the final adoption of the annual report, the state commission shall 21 distribute a draft of the report to all institutions and 22 programs of the types enumerated in Paragraph (2) of Subsection 23 A of Section [2A (2)] 21-2-2 NMSA 1978 and to representatives 24 25 of all other interests enumerated in Section [6] 21-2-6 NMSA .211897.1
