11 MAKING AN APPROPRIATION TO THE STATE PARKS DIVISION OF THE
12 ENERGY, MINERALS AND NATURAL RESOURCES DEPARTMENT FOR VARIOUS
13 PROJECTS STATEWIDE.
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15 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:

16 SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION--STATE PARKS DIVISION OF THE
17 ENERGY, MINERALS AND NATURAL RESOURCES DEPARTMENT PROJECTS.--

18 A. The following amounts are appropriated from the
19 general fund to the state parks division of the energy,
20 minerals and natural resources department for expenditure in
21 fiscal years 2019 through 2023:

22 (1) one hundred twenty-five thousand dollars
23 (\$125,000) to plan, design, construct and equip a self-pay
24 kiosk system at Caballo Lake state park;

25 (2) five hundred thousand dollars (\$500,000)

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1 to plan, design, construct and equip a water treatment system
2 at Conchas Lake state park;

3 (3) two hundred thousand dollars (\$200,000) to
4 refurbish and improve the dump station at Brantley Lake state
5 park;

6 (4) five hundred thousand dollars (\$500,000)
7 to plan, design, construct and equip a recreational vehicle
8 dump station at Elephant Butte Lake state park;

9 (5) eight hundred thousand dollars (\$800,000)
10 to plan, design, construct and equip water and wastewater
11 improvements at Elephant Butte Lake state park;

12 (6) six hundred thousand dollars (\$600,000) to
13 plan, design, construct and equip a group shelter at the
14 Monticello campground and windbreaks for existing campgrounds
15 at Elephant Butte Lake state park;

16 (7) one hundred twenty-five thousand dollars
17 (\$125,000) to plan, design, construct and equip a self-pay
18 kiosk system at Elephant Butte Lake state park;

19 (8) five hundred thousand dollars (\$500,000)
20 to plan, design, construct, renovate and equip a water
21 treatment plant, including removal and replacement of existing
22 water treatment plant equipment, at Navajo Lake state park;

23 (9) three hundred thousand dollars (\$300,000)
24 to plan, design, construct, renovate and equip a water pump and
25 water pump infrastructure at Navajo Lake state park;

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1 (10) two million dollars (\$2,000,000) to
2 acquire land for and to plan, design, construct, equip,
3 renovate and improve Pecos Canyon state park in San Miguel
4 county;

5 (11) two hundred fifty thousand dollars
6 (\$250,000) to plan, design, construct and upgrade water
7 infrastructure at Sugarite Canyon state park;

8 (12) two hundred fifty thousand dollars
9 (\$250,000) to plan, design, construct and equip flooding and
10 erosion control improvements at state parks statewide;

11 (13) two hundred fifty thousand dollars
12 (\$250,000) to plan, design, construct, renovate and equip
13 campsite improvements at state parks statewide;

14 (14) two hundred fifty thousand dollars
15 (\$250,000) to plan, design, construct, renovate and equip road
16 improvements at state parks statewide;

17 (15) five hundred thousand dollars (\$500,000)
18 to plan, design, construct, renovate, equip and install group
19 shelters and park furnishings at state parks statewide; and

20 (16) two hundred fifty thousand dollars
21 (\$250,000) to plan, design, renovate and equip comfort stations
22 at state parks statewide.

23 B. Any unexpended or unencumbered balance of an
24 appropriation made for a project pursuant to this section shall
25 revert to the general fund within six months of completion of

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1 the project, but no later than the end of fiscal year 2023.

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
