A MEMORIAL

REQUESTING THAT REFORM OF NEW MEXICO'S EDUCATIONAL SYSTEM  
INCLUDE LEARNING ABOUT ACEQUIAS AND LAND GRANTS AS PART OF A  
MULTICULTURAL AND EQUITABLE EDUCATION FOR DIVERSE STUDENT  
POPULATIONS IN NEW MEXICO.

WHEREAS, New Mexico is home to cultures and communities  
with diverse student populations that are deserving of an  
equitable, sufficient and meaningful education; and

WHEREAS, because of limited resources, schools are not  
able to integrate learning about cultural resources and assets  
in their own communities; and

WHEREAS, decades of inadequate resources for schools have  
resulted in racial, economic and educational disparities that  
rank among the worst in the country; and

WHEREAS, in a landmark decision, a court ruled in the

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1 *Yazzie/Martinez v. State of New Mexico* case that the state must  
2 take immediate steps to support students; and

3 WHEREAS, the decision also highlighted the need for  
4 multicultural and multilingual learning opportunities that  
5 respond to cultures, languages and heritages of diverse student  
6 populations; and

7 WHEREAS, acequias and land grants are vital parts of New  
8 Mexico's culture, history and social fabric and continue to be  
9 relevant in community development in rural communities  
10 throughout the state; and

11 WHEREAS, culturally relevant education in New Mexico  
12 should include the study of the historical development of  
13 acequia and land grant communities and the contemporary issues  
14 and challenges they face; and

15 WHEREAS, research shows that a multicultural and  
16 multilingual approach to education allows students to maintain  
17 their language and cultural identity, which contributes to  
18 their well-being and performance in school;

19 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF  
20 REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO that education about  
21 acequias and land grants be part of a broader transformation of  
22 education in New Mexico to ensure sufficient and equitable  
23 education for diverse student populations; and

24 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the public education  
25 department be requested to develop methods to integrate

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1 learning about acequias and land grants into the curriculum and  
2 that the higher education department be requested to train and  
3 develop educators for multicultural curriculum development; and

4 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the center for the education  
5 and study of diverse populations and the Ben Lujan leadership  
6 and public policy institute at New Mexico highlands university  
7 be requested to convene educators, community leaders and  
8 stakeholders to develop and provide recommendations to the  
9 public education department and higher education department on  
10 how to reshape New Mexico's educational system to include a  
11 culturally relevant curriculum that includes acequias and land  
12 grants; and

13 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the New Mexico acequia  
14 association, acequia commission, land grant council and New  
15 Mexico land grant consejo be requested to develop and provide  
16 recommendations to the public education department and higher  
17 education department for integration of acequias and land  
18 grants into multicultural curriculum development; and

19 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that copies of this memorial be  
20 transmitted to the secretary of public education, the secretary  
21 of higher education, the president of New Mexico highlands  
22 university, the chair of the acequia commission, the executive  
23 director of the New Mexico acequia association, the chair of  
24 the land grant council and the president of the New Mexico land  
25 grant consejo.

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
