15	SECTION 1. Section 14-2-12 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1993,
16	Chapter 258, Section 9) is amended to read:
17	"14-2-12. ENFORCEMENTRETALIATION
18	A. An action to enforce the Inspection of Public
19	Records Act may be brought by:
20	(1) the attorney general or the district
21	attorney in the county of jurisdiction; or
22	(2) a person whose written request has been
23	denied.
24	B. A district court may issue a writ of mandamus or
25	order an injunction or other appropriate remedy to enforce the

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provisions of the Inspection of Public Records Act.

- C. The exhaustion of administrative remedies shall not be required prior to bringing any action to enforce the procedures of the Inspection of Public Records Act.
- D. The court shall award damages, costs and reasonable [attorneys'] attorney fees to any person whose written request has been denied and that is successful in a court action to enforce the provisions of the Inspection of Public Records Act.
- E. A custodian, public body or employee of a public body shall not take any retaliatory action against a person that has:
- (1) submitted an oral or written request for records pursuant to the Inspection of Public Records Act; or
- (2) requested information on the process of submitting a public records request.
- F. The court shall award compensatory damages, punitive damages, costs and reasonable attorney fees to any person that brings a successful court action against a custodian, public body or employee of a public body for a violation of Subsection E of this section.
- G. For the purposes of this section, "retaliatory action" includes any action or conduct that would discourage a reasonable person from submitting a request or pursuing the enforcement of a request pursuant to the Inspection of Public .219000.2
