HOUSE EXECUTIVE MESSAGE NO. 21

Dear Speaker Martinez and Members of the House:

I have decided to veto HOUSE BILL 126, as amended (“HB 126”), which would have reduced the minimum number of course units required for students to graduate from high school.

As Governor of New Mexico, I am deeply committed to ensuring that our students receive the highest quality education possible. I firmly believe that education is the foundation of a successful society and a strong economy, and that we must do everything in our power to provide our students with the tools they need to succeed. HB 126 lowers the minimum requirements to graduate from high school and weakens graduation standards by removing the current requirement that students complete one course unit in either career/workplace readiness or a language other than English; by removing the requirement that students complete one course unit in dual credit, honors, advanced placement, or distance learning; and by reducing physical education requirements.

The challenges of the 21st century demand that our students be well-prepared, well-educated, and well-rounded individuals. I encourage you to work with my administration during the interim to find ways to strengthen our educational system and support the diverse needs of New Mexico students and families. Together we can achieve transformational change in our schools that will ensure all students are successful from their earliest years, through college and career.

Because of these issues, and pursuant to my authority under Article IV, Section 22 of the New Mexico Constitution, I have vetoed HOUSE BILL 126, as amended, enacted by the Fifty-Sixth Legislature, First Session, 2023.
