10 AN ACT

11 RELATING TO TECHNOLOGY; CREATING THE DATA INTEGRATION ADVISORY  
12 COMMITTEE TO STUDY, REPORT AND PROVIDE RECOMMENDATIONS ON THE  
13 MAINTENANCE AND UTILIZATION OF DATA IN STATE GOVERNMENT;  
14 REQUIRING REPORTING; MAKING AN APPROPRIATION.  
15

16 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:

17 SECTION 1. TEMPORARY PROVISION--DATA INTEGRATION ADVISORY  
18 COMMITTEE--CREATED--DUTIES--REPORTING.--

19 A. The "data integration advisory committee" is  
20 created in the department of information technology. The data  
21 integration advisory committee shall exist from the date of its  
22 appointment, which shall be no later than August 1, 2023, until  
23 January 1, 2026. Staff and administrative support for the  
24 committee shall be coordinated by the New Mexico institute of  
25 mining and technology's institute for complex additive systems

1 analysis. The committee consists of the following members:

2 (1) the director of the institute for complex  
3 additive systems analysis at the New Mexico institute of mining  
4 and technology or the director's designee, who shall be the  
5 chair;

6 (2) the secretary of information technology;

7 (3) one member or designee of the senate who  
8 shall have expertise in the application of technological  
9 solutions to public sector data, appointed by the president pro  
10 tempore of the senate;

11 (4) one member or designee of the house of  
12 representatives who shall have expertise in the application of  
13 technological solutions to public sector data, appointed by the  
14 speaker of the house of representatives;

15 (5) one member who represents the office of  
16 the attorney general, appointed by the attorney general;

17 (6) one member who is an attorney or is an  
18 expert in data sharing and compliance, appointed by the  
19 governor;

20 (7) one member who is an expert in education  
21 and educational systems in New Mexico, appointed by the  
22 governor;

23 (8) one member who is an expert in health care  
24 and public health in New Mexico, appointed by the governor;

25 (9) one member who represents state courts,

1 appointed by the chief justice of the supreme court;

2 (10) one member who represents counties who  
3 shall have expertise in the application of technological  
4 solutions to public sector data, appointed by New Mexico  
5 association of counties; and

6 (11) one member who represents cities who  
7 shall have expertise in the application of technological  
8 solutions to public sector data, appointed by the New Mexico  
9 municipal league.

10 B. Public members of the data integration advisory  
11 committee are entitled to receive per diem and mileage pursuant  
12 to the Per Diem and Mileage Act but shall receive no other  
13 compensation, perquisite or allowance.

14 C. The data integration advisory committee shall  
15 meet at a frequency that is necessary to complete its duties or  
16 as determined by the New Mexico institute of mining and  
17 technology.

18 D. A vacancy on the data integration advisory  
19 committee shall be filled by the original appointing authority.

20 E. A majority of members constitutes a quorum for  
21 the transaction of business.

22 F. Meetings of the data integration advisory  
23 committee shall be subject to the Open Meetings Act.

24 G. The data integration advisory committee shall  
25 conduct a statewide study on the current data structure,

1 sharing and reporting protocols for all state and local  
2 agencies and entities that have access to data stored by state  
3 and local agencies. The study shall determine:

4 (1) current gaps in data maintenance and  
5 utilization;

6 (2) mapping of data sharing flows between  
7 agencies; and

8 (3) the costs and processes necessary to  
9 centralize the storage and protection of data.

10 H. Upon completion of the study, the data  
11 integration advisory committee shall:

12 (1) establish suggested procedures to ensure  
13 that data are compiled, maintained and shared efficiently to  
14 promote a streamlined experience for public users; and

15 (2) recommend a long-term data governance  
16 structure to promote statewide data management and sharing.

17 I. On or before January 1, 2025, the data  
18 integration advisory committee shall complete its work and  
19 present to the legislative finance committee a summary of the  
20 advisory committee's findings, including, if appropriate,  
21 proposals for legislation.

22 J. From January 1, 2025 through January 1, 2026,  
23 the data integration advisory committee shall coordinate with  
24 the New Mexico institute of mining and technology to  
25 incorporate feedback from the legislative finance committee in

1 the data integration advisory committee's report and submit  
2 final recommendations and procedures for statewide data  
3 management to the legislature, the executive and other impacted  
4 entities by January 1, 2026.

5 K. As used in this section:

6 (1) "data" means any versions of statistical  
7 or factual information that are reflected in a list, table,  
8 graph, chart or other non-narrative form that can be digitally  
9 or non-digitally transmitted or processed; and

10 (2) "agency" means any board, commission,  
11 department, office or other administrative unit of the state or  
12 of a local government, including the agency head, agency staff  
13 or other persons purporting to act on behalf of or under the  
14 authority of the agency.

15 SECTION 2. APPROPRIATION.--Two million dollars  
16 (\$2,000,000) is appropriated from the general fund to the board  
17 of regents of the New Mexico institute of mining and technology  
18 for expenditure in fiscal years 2024 and 2025 to convene,  
19 organize and manage the data integration advisory committee to  
20 conduct a statewide data inventory study and to oversee the  
21 development of the associated report to the legislative finance  
22 committee. Any unexpended or unencumbered balance remaining at  
23 the end of fiscal year 2025 shall revert to the general fund.
