A MEMORIAL

DECLARING JANUARY 26, 2023 "AUTISM DAY" IN THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES.

WHEREAS, autism spectrum disorder is a neurological disorder that interferes with the development of communication and social interaction skills; and

WHEREAS, in 2018, the federal centers for disease control and prevention reported that one in every forty-four children is diagnosed as having an autism spectrum disorder; and

WHEREAS, autism affects people of all races and religions and all educational and economic levels; and

WHEREAS, autism is a lifelong condition that presents challenges to education, employment, housing and community development; and

WHEREAS, parents, professionals, self-advocates and

4 proven support systems greatly improve the outcomes and reduce  
5 the lifelong costs of care of individuals with autism and their

8 contributions to its communities, businesses, technologies and  
9 cultures made by people with autism; and

10 WHEREAS, the many professionals, families, advocates and  
11 volunteers working to promote a greater understanding of autism  
12 to improve the quality of life of those affected by autism are  
13 to be commended;

14 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF  
15 REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO that January 26,  
16 2023 be declared "Autism Day" in the house of representatives;
