BILL SUMMARY

Synopsis:

House Bill 16 proposes to create a new section of the Criminal Sentencing Act to allow a sentencing enhancement above the basic sentence for trafficking fentanyl if certain conditions are met. The enhancement can be up to three years if the offender possesses between 100 and 500 fentanyl pills or the equivalent powder amount, or up to five years if the person possesses more than 500 fentanyl pills or the equivalent powder amount, or has found to have organized, coordinated or directed fentanyl trafficking.
