BILL SUMMARY

<u>Synopsis:</u> HB 26 amends the crime of ticket scalping to include events presented by the state or political subdivisions of the state or by nonprofit corporations.

SIGNIFICANT ISSUES

HB 26 amends the Ticket Scalping law to expand the definition of ticket scalping in New Mexico to include events presented by the state, a political subdivision of the state or nonprofit corporations formally recognized as tax exempt. As such, any event presented by the New Mexico Tourism Department (NMTD) or other state agency would fall under the Ticket Scalping law, making it a crime for whoever commits ticket scalping. They could be found guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction, could be punished by a fine up to five hundred dollars (\$500) or by imprisonment for a term of less than one year or both.
