SECTION III: NARRATIVE

BILL SUMMARY

<u>Synopsis:</u> HB 38 introduces the crime of unlawful possession of a weapon conversion device in New Mexico. It defines a "weapon conversion device" as any part or combination of parts designed to convert a semiautomatic weapon into a fully automatic weapon. Under the bill, knowingly possessing or transporting such a device is a third-degree felony. Each device found is considered a separate offense. Additionally, HB 38 provides clear definitions for "fully automatic weapon," "semiautomatic weapon," and "weapon conversion device," which will help law enforcement enforce the law effectively.

This bill addresses a critical public safety concern by preventing the illegal conversion of semiautomatic firearms into fully automatic ones. By criminalizing the possession and transportation of weapon conversion devices, HB 38 helps deter illegal firearm modifications, while also encouraging responsible gun ownership. The bill strengthens existing firearm regulations and supports law enforcement efforts to reduce gun violence, ensuring that dangerous firearms do not fall into the wrong hands.

The Adult Parole Board supports HB 38, recognizing that it will contribute to enhanced public safety and may help reduce firearm-related crimes. Those convicted under this law would face clear legal consequences, helping the parole board make informed decisions about parole eligibility.

Moreover, the bill will assist law enforcement in identifying and preventing the illegal possession of dangerous firearms and conversion devices. By providing clear legal guidelines and reinforcing penalties for firearm-related offenses, HB 38 contributes to a safer environment for both the public and law enforcement. Ultimately, the bill strengthens the criminal justice system, fosters safer communities, and supports better outcomes for parolees, aligning with the parole board's goals of rehabilitation, public safety, and reducing recidivism.
