BILL SUMMARY

<u>Synopsis:</u> House Bill 49 (HB 49) enacts the Closed Captioning Act, requiring places of public accommodation, including libraries and museums, to provide closed captioning for audio portions of content on television displays. The Attorney General is given authority to enforce with penalty for violation to comply.

PERFORMANCE IMPLICATIONS

HB49 requires existing television receivers with close captioning capabilities to have close captioning activated on the receivers.
