BILL SUMMARY

Synopsis: HB 50 Provides that multiple violations of the crimes of unlawful taking of, embezzlement of, or fraudulently obtaining or receiving or transporting stolen vehicles apply toward sentencing regardless of which section of law was previously violated. Sets (effectively enhanced) penalties.

Whoever commits any of the cited crimes is guilty of a:

- fourth degree felony for a first offense
- third degree felony for a second offense, regardless of which provision was the first offense
- second degree felony for a third or subsequent offense, regardless of which provision was the first or second offense.
