BILL SUMMARY

Comments from the New Mexico Hospital Association:

- This bill addresses PBMs and insurers implementing discriminatory reimbursement that negatively impacts 340B entities by setting lower reimbursement for medications due to their participation in the 340B program. This means pharmaceutical manufacturers keep the savings meant for 340B entities for themselves, which limits the investments in access to care that 340B entities would otherwise be able to make.
- Passage of HB 78 would be as a significant alignment in state law to protect the 340B program for the 19 hospitals, dozens of federally funded health centers, public health offices, and Urban Indian Health Centers that are covered entities in New Mexico under the program.
- Utilizing the program allows participating providers to stretch limited federal resources to reduce the price of outpatient pharmaceuticals for patients, especially vulnerable patients and patients in underserved areas, and to reinvest the savings into services that are vital to meeting the needs of underserved communities across our state.
- HB 78 will prohibit interference with the program via changes to the New Mexico Insurance Code, an important step in protecting access to care in our state.
