Synopsis:

HB 85 would create a new statutory provision that would:

- 1) prohibit the installation of nonfunctional turf on State-Owned or State-Funded property beginning in 2027;
- 2) prohibit the use of water other than recycled or reclaimed water to irrigate nonfunctional turf on State-Owned or State-Funded property beginning in 2032; and
- 3) require that nonfunctional turf on State-Owned or State-Funded property that is removed be replaced with drought and climate resilient landscapes beginning in 2032.
