BILL SUMMARY

Broadens the definition of "sexual exploitation of children by prostitution" to include all minors up to the age of 18, rather than just those under 16. Increases the penalty for human trafficking. Additionally, the bill specifies that it is not a valid defense if the victim involved in such a crime is a police officer posing as a minor. Human trafficking would be included as a crime of racketeering and no one convicted of human trafficking could earn meritorious deductions to ameliorate a sentence.

PERFORMANCE IMPLICATIONS

This bill would provide much needed updates to the statutes related to Human Trafficking in New Mexico. As it currently stands the penalties for trafficking a controlled substance are greater than for trafficking human beings. It is critical this loophole in the law be closed. DPS strongly supports this bill and believes it will give law enforcement additional tools to deal with a crime that has become increasingly prevalent in our communities. Human Trafficking often targets the most vulnerable populations of our state, in particular our youth. It is critical we have additional resources to help protect them.
