BILL SUMMARY

Synopsis:

HB99 amends existing provisions relating to nonrepairable vehicle certificates. It introduces new processes for insurance companies to handle total loss claims involving nonrepairable vehicles and moves existing language concerning nonrepairable vehicles to the newly created Section 66-3-4.1 NMSA 1978.

Section 1: This section removes the language concerning nonrepairable vehicles which is then moved into Section 66-3-4.1.

Section 2: New Section 66-3-4.1 NMSA 1978. The text removed from Section 66-3-4 NMSA 1978 is moved into this new Section. This Section contains additional language dealing with circumstances in which an insurance company pays a total loss claim for a vehicle and takes possession but cannot obtain the title or other acceptable ownership evidence. Section 2(F).
