SECTION III: NARRATIVE

BILL SUMMARY

Synopsis: This bill creates on "Office of Accessibility" within the Governor's Commission on Disability, and codifies in statute the accessibility standards set by federal rule under the Americans with Disabilities Act.

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

OBAE is in the process of entering into a professional services contract to:

- 1) Report as to OBAE's website compliance with the Web Content Accessibility Guidelines (WCAG) that must be implemented by April 24, 2026 pursuant to the 28 CFR Part 35; and
- 2) Create training materials for OBAE grant awardees to utilize in ensuring their own compliance with the WCAG. This is a component of OBAE's Digital Equity Plan.

This contract is the basis for our FY25 fiscal assumptions.

Other state agencies have reported spending a minimum of \$250,000 on website redesigns in recent years, so OBAE assumed such as the minimum cost to bring our website into compliance in FY26.

Finally, OBAE assumed the need for a recurring professional services contract to maintain the ADA compliance on digital materials for future years.

SIGNIFICANT ISSUES

This bill is silent on whether state agency contractors, subcontractors, or grantees are required to comply with the Accessibility Act.

OBAE has already begun the process of assessing and moving towards full compliance with the final rule revising Title II of the ADA.

WHAT WILL BE THE CONSEQUENCES OF NOT ENACTING THIS BILL

The United States Department of Justice issued its final rule revising the regulation implementing Title II of the ADA regarding web and mobile application accessibility. New Mexico must fully comply with the final rule by April 24, 2026, regardless of the passage of this bill. The Governor's Office has already directed state agencies to begin review and take corrective action where necessary, with a written report due by July 1, 2025.
