<u>Synopsis:</u> Related to school personnel; Increases the minimum salaries for teachers, school counselors, and school administrators.

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

No appropriations are noted in the bill. However, minimal impact related to Level I teachers with an expected cost of no more than \$2,570 over three years. NMSBVI already has a starting salary for Level II and Level III teachers at or above the proposed amounts.

SIGNIFICANT ISSUES

Increasing the starting salary amount for each level of teacher certification by \$5,000 continues the process of making NM teacher salaries competitive.
