#### **BILL SUMMARY**

Synopsis: Section 1 the bill removes the definition of responsibility factor, adds a definition for a site administrator, and modifies the definition of a state institution. Section 2 adds the requirement for background checks to be performed on school principals, site administrators, superintendents, and student teachers. Section 3 adds the requirement for site administrators and superintendents to be licensed. Section 4 provides the requirements for obtaining a provisional site administrator license. Section 5 provides the requirements for obtaining an initial site administrator license. Section 6 provides the requirements for obtaining a professional site administrator license. Section 7 provides the requirements for obtaining a provisional superintendent license. Section 8 provides the requirements for obtaining a superintendent license. Section 9 allows the department to establish new licensure requirements. Section 10 adds requirements for how an out-of-state candidate may be licensed. Section 11 provides emergency powers for granting a license waiver. Section 12 is the short title for new statutory language. Section 13 adds new definitions. Section 14 provides standards for how site administrators are trained. Section 15 calls for the delayed repeal of sections 22-10A-11.3, 22-10A-11.4, and 22-10A-17.2 effective July 1, 2028.
