BILL SUMMARY

Synopsis:

HB164 Amends Chapter 10, Article 11, Section 118 to include an increase of two percent for a normal retired member of state or local government, who has attained the age of 65 before July 1, 2025.

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

HB164 makes a one-time appropriation of \$10M which shall not revert to the general fund.

SIGNIFICANT ISSUES

PERFORMANCE IMPLICATIONS

State employees, and prospective state employees, may find a cost-of-living increase to their earned retirement payments an incentive to join or remain in state public service until their retirement. This may help with recruitment and retention if communicated to the public and employees. Having state employees retire when eligible will also allow for upward mobility of those currently in the classified service who would gain career advancement and lower the average compa-ratio for a job family based on the retirement of high earning employees, which could save the state money.
