#### 1. BILL SUMMARY

### a) Synopsis

House Bill 171 allows custodial care facilities to acquire, stock, and maintain controlled substances used for withdrawal management purposes. Custodial care facilities would include nursing homes, residential treatment facilities, and outpatient behavioral health facilities operated by NMDOH.

#### b) Significant Issues

- This bill would expand the ability of certain types of facilities to provide MOUD to clients and residents.
- There are a variety of requirements for pharmacies to stock controlled substances for withdrawal management. Those are not changed in this bill.
- This bill does not direct facilities to offer this but does allow them the opportunity to provide them when needed.
- Given that the main NMDOH operated facilities who offer this service are licensed as hospitals, they are already providing this service and this bill would have minimal impact on the NMDOH facilities.
