BILL SUMMARY

Synopsis:

<u>Section 1</u> amends Section 35-1-10 entitled "Magistrate Court – Dona Ana District." This statute currently provides that there shall be seven magistrates in the Dona Ana magistrate district. "All seven shall operate as a single court in Las Cruces and rotate riding circuit to Anthony and Hatch on a regularly scheduled basis."

This bill adds the communities of Sunland Park and Chaparral to the rotating riding circuit for the magistrates.
