### **SECTION III: NARRATIVE**

This analysis is neither a formal Opinion nor an Advisory Letter issued by the New Mexico Department of Justice. This is a staff analysis in response to a committee or legislator's request. The analysis does not represent any official policy or legal position of the NM Department of Justice.

#### **BILL SUMMARY**

Synopsis: The bill would allow a qualified elector to register to vote when applying for a hunting or fishing license, i.e., through the New Mexico Department of Game and Fish. As set forth in more detail below, it would specifically amend NMSA 1978, § 1-4-5.2 (2023) and NMSA 1978, § 1-4-48 (2023), accordingly.

For context, it warrants observing that the 2023 amendments to Section 1-4-5.2 and 1-4-48 are set to take effect July 1, 2025 and, as noted in the annotations to those statutory sections, provided for automatic voter registration at certain state agencies.

**Section 1** of the bill would amend Section 1-4-5.2(C) (2023) so that a qualified elector may register to vote "through the department of game and fish at the time the qualified elector applies for a hunting or fishing license pursuant to" NMSA 1978, § 17-3-5. (Note: Section 17-3-5 is the general statutory section governing applications for hunting and fishing licenses).

**Section 2** would amend NMSA 1978, § 1-4-48 in several respects. First, it would change references in the title of Section 1-4-48, and in Section 1-4-48(F), which currently refer to the Human Services Department, to its correct name of the "Health Care Authority" (department). (That change simply reflects the previous 2023 name change of the Human Services Department to its new name as the Health Care Authority, as noted in the annotations to Section 1-4-48).

It would also amend Section 1-4-48(B), by adding a new subsection (B)(2), so that voter registration shall be made available through the "department of game and fish by a license vendor appointed and authorized by the director of the department of game and fish to accept applications and issue licenses for hunting or fishing."

**Section 3** specifies that the effective date of the bill would be July 1, 2025.
