BILL SUMMARY

The bill adds: assault, battery, criminal sexual contact, and robbery with a deadly weapon, to the list of crimes that are qualifying offenses for victim reparations to defray victims' expenses arising from the victimization.

Synopsis: The bill adds four new crimes to the list of victimizations which would qualify for victim reparations.

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

CVRC historically, has identified alternative methods to cover some of these expenses. CVRC does not expect any significan financial impact.

CVRC has to search for collateral sources of support for compensation of victim expenses for offenses not enumerated in statute. Robbery victims have been served by CVRC as aggravated assault survivors, an enumerated offense.
