SECTION III: NARRATIVE

BILL SUMMARY

House Bill 233 (HB233) amends certain sections of the Insurance Code to require coverage for durable medical equipment for the treatment of active diabetic foot ulcers, including topical oxygen therapy. Section 5 of the HB233 applies the requirement to self-insurance provided pursuant to the Health Care Purchasing Act, and all individual, group health insurance policies, health care plans, certificates of health insurance, managed health care plans contracts of health insurance, group health plans provided through a cooperative, individual and group health maintenance organization contracts, health benefit plans and group health coverage offered, delivered or issued for delivery, renewed, extended or amended in New Mexico. HB233 requires that coverage shall begin in the described insurance policies, plans, and certificates of health insurance on January 1, 2026.

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

OSI does not anticipate any fiscal implications or premium impacts.

SIGNIFICANT ISSUES

This bill clarifies that medically necessary treatment of active diabetic foot ulcers includes topical oxygen therapy, which is aligned with the American Diabetes Association recommendation for an adjunctive treatment for chronic diabetic foot ulcers. See 2023 standards of care in diabetes Clinical Practice Guidance (CPG) in the space.

The Insurance Code requires all commercial plans to provide coverage for individuals with diabetes. This coverage entitles each individual to the medically accepted standard of medical care for diabetes. Therefore, medically necessary coverage for Topical Oxygen Treatment (TOT) should not create a new mandate and trigger defrayal.

However, OSI is concerned that TOT does not qualify as Durable Medical Equipment (DME). Therefore, we are proposing to remove references in the bill to DME and require coverage for medically necessary diabetic foot ulcers, including TOT, as follows:

- "When prescribed or diagnosed by a health care practitioner with prescribing authority, all individuals with diabetes as described in Subsection A of this section enrolled in health policies described in that subsection shall be entitled to the following basic health care benefits:
- (1) diabetes self-management training that shall be provided by a certified, registered or licensed health care professional with recent education in diabetes management, which shall be limited to:
- (a) medically necessary visits upon the diagnosis of diabetes;
- (b) visits following a diagnosis from a health care practitioner that represents a significant change in the patient's symptoms or condition that warrants changes in the patient's self-management; and
- (c) visits when re-education or refresher training is prescribed by a health care practitioner with prescribing authority; and
- (2) medical nutrition therapy related to diabetes management;
- (3) medically necessary treatment of active diabetic foot ulcers, including topical oxygen therapy."
