BILL SUMMARY

Synopsis:

HB 318 amends Section 30-22-1, NMSA 1978 as follows:

- Adds language on page 2, line 13 that clarifies that paragraph (4).
- Adds language on page 2, lines 15 and 16 that increases the penalty from a misdemeanor to a fourth-degree felony.

SIGNIFICANT ISSUES

A conviction for Resisting, Evading or Obstructing an Officer is presently a misdemeanor, punishable by up to 364 days jail and a \$1000 fine.

The proposed amendment to the statute will make it a fourth-degree felony punishable by up to 18 months in the state penitentiary and a \$5000 fine.

Judges and magistrates are included as "officers" for purposes of the statute.
