BILL SUMMARY

<u>Synopsis:</u> House Bill 318 proposes to amend the Criminal Code to increase the penalty for resisting, evading or obstructing an officer of this state from a misdemeanor to a fourth-degree felony.

Provisions of the act apply to:

- any officer or duly authorized person serving or attempting to serve or execute process or any rule or order of the courts of this state or any other judicial writ or process;
- intentionally fleeing, attempting to evade or evading an officer of this state when the person has knowledge that the officer is attempting to apprehend or arrest the person;
- willfully refusing to bring a vehicle to a stop when given a visual or audible signal to stop by a uniformed officer in an appropriately marked vehicle;
- resisting or abusing any judge, magistrate or peace officer in the lawful discharge of duties.

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

While it is likely that department would see only a moderate rise in the number of offenders entering the correctional system, given the relatively shorty sentences associated with fourth-degree felonies and the possibility for alternatives to prison, the department's resources would likely be sufficient to handle the increase without causing significant fiscal strain.
