BILL SUMMARY

Synopsis:

House bill 319 (HB 319) amends Section 17-2-3 NMSA (being laws 1967, Chapter 8, Section 1, as amended) to provide an exception for domestic strains of quail from being considered protected game birds in New Mexico and adds a new section to allow domestic quail to be raised for meat or eggs without a permit.

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

There would be no fiscal implications to the New Mexico Department of Agriculture (NMDA).

SIGNIFICANT ISSUES

Under Section 17-2-3 NMSA 1978, all species within the family Phasianidae, including quail, are regulated as game species under the jurisdiction of the New Mexico State Game Commision. The New Mexico Department of Game and Fish (NMDGF) currently requires a permit for all quail species kept in captivity.

There are four native species of quail in New Mexico: Scaled quail, Gambel's quail, Northern bobwhite, and Montezuma quail. Nationally, the Coturnix quail is the most common species of domesticated quail.

NMDA does not have any agency statutes regulating quail products or facilities in New Mexico.

If HB 319 is not enacted, all quail species will remain defined as game bird species under Section 17-2-3 NMSA 1978 and NMDGF will maintain current permitting requirements for domestic quail.
