SECTION III: NARRATIVE

BILL SUMMARY

<u>Synopsis:</u> HB 349 requires the Department of Health (DOH) to contract with an entity or multiple entities to develop a total health care expenditure database. The database would then be maintained by DOH in tracking health care claim payments, non-claim payments and non-medical cost drivers. The bill requires DOH to issue a request for proposal by October 1, 2025 for the all-payers database with the \$500,000 appropriation for use in FY 2026 and FY 2027.

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

HB 349 provides an appropriation of \$500,000 for FY 2026-FY 2027 to the DOH to contract for the development and maintenance of a health care expenditure database. The appropriation from the GF is non-reverting. The bill could potentially have a fiscal impact on HCA and the Medicaid program and administrative costs, to the extent additional staff are needed to interface with the development and use the all-payer claims data base in FY 2026 and FY 2027. An IT business analyst will cost \$150,200 or \$75,100 general fund.
