#### **BILL SUMMARY**

Synopsis: SB 358 aims to enhance oversight and accountability in the rulemaking process by executive agencies. It proposes the establishment of the Interim Administrative Rule Oversight Committee, which will be responsible for reviewing proposed rules put forward by executive agencies. The bill also mandates that any proposed rule with an implementation cost exceeding one million dollars (\$1,000,000) must include a fiscal impact statement as part of the notice of proposed rulemaking. Additionally, it includes provisions for the necessary appropriations to support these changes. The goal is to ensure that legislative bodies are well-informed of the financial implications of proposed rules and that there is a systematic review to enhance transparency and efficiency
