BILL SUMMARY

Creates new regulations and new civil and criminal penalties related to the use and dissemination of AI-generated content — establishing liability, labeling and enforcement mechanisms related to creating digital fakes of a person's likeness without their consent and other digitally-manipulated content.

With the rise of synthetic content created by AI, this bill provides clear definitions of liability, ensuring individuals who harm others by spreading synthetic content are held accountable. The bill provides specific circumstances under which dissemination is improper, helping law enforcement and the judiciary recognize when actions cross a legal line.

This bill provides allowances for freedom of expression and legitimate uses of synthetic content, such as in legal, medical, educational, or artistic contexts. Section 3 acknowledges that not all dissemination is harmful, providing exceptions for lawful and non-malicious purposes. This ensures that legitimate content creators or organizations are not unnecessarily hindered by overly broad regulations.

By creating both civil and criminal liabilities for the improper dissemination of synthetic content, the law serves as a deterrent to would-be offenders. Penalties for such conduct help curb malicious uses of synthetic media, contributing to the broader goal of reducing cybercrimes and ensuring digital safety.
