### **SECTION III: NARRATIVE**

#### **BILL SUMMARY**

Synopsis: House Bill 413 (HB 413) enacts the “Physician Assistant Licensure Interstate Compact” (Compact) in order to strengthen access to medical services and to complement the existing authority of state licensing boards to license and discipline physician assistants and seeks to enhance the portability of a license to practice as a physician assistant while safeguarding the safety of patients.

The practice and delivery of medical service occurs where the patient is located at the time of the patient encounter and requires the physician assistance to be under the jurisdiction of the state licensing board where the patient is located. Participating boards in the interstate compact retain jurisdiction to impose adverse actions. Alleviates burdens on active-duty military personnel and their families by allowing active-duty military personnel and their spouses to obtain a compact privilege.
