#### **SECTION III: NARRATIVE**

#### **BILL SUMMARY**

**House Bill 420** proposes an appropriation of \$6,000,000 to the Health Care Authority for expenditure to address transitional housing support needs for the reentry population and administer a housing stabilization program.

#### FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

**House Bill 420** proposes a \$6,000,000 appropriation to the Health Care Authority from the general fund for expenditures in state fiscal year 2026. Any unexpended or unencumbered balances remaining at the end of the fiscal year 2026 will revert to the general fund.

#### **SIGNIFICANT ISSUES**

- The bill allocates \$6,000,000 for transitional housing support needs for the reentry population which is intended to reduce homelessness and recidivism.
- According to the Prison Policy Initiative, New Mexico has an incarceration rate of 647 per 100,000 people which stresses the importance of transitional housing for individuals exiting incarceration in the state.
- New Mexico has a recidivism rate of 37%, which is higher than the national average. A factor of recidivism for released inmates includes a challenge in securing a long-term, safe place to live.
- There is currently no federal funding programs specifically geared toward the reentry population.
