### **SECTION III: NARRATIVE**

#### **BILL SUMMARY**

<u>Synopsis:</u> This Bill enacts the "Health Data Privacy Act" which defines various items in the Health Data Privacy Act, such as de-identified data, process, regulated entity, regulated health information, service provider, and third party. The Bill pertains to regulated entities and processing of regulated health information including the collection, use, access, sharing, sale, monetization, brokerage, analysis, retention, creation, generation, derivation, recording, organization, structuring, modification, storage, disclosure, transmission, disposal, licensing, destruction, deletion, modification or reidentification. The Bill would be effective July 1, 2025.

#### FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

The fiscal impact of the legislation on the New Mexico Retiree Health Care Authority (NMRHCA) already follows Federal HIPAA laws and other state privacy laws. However, SB430 introduces new provisions to further protect the privacy and security of health information, including ensuring compliance and transparency with the broader scope of the processing by third parties who are contracted for analytics of plan data. There may be some required adjustments to comply with the new proposed requirements of the Health Data Privacy Act but anticipate minimal impact.

#### **SIGNIFICANT ISSUES**

This bill will require an evaluation of current policies and practices to protect patient health information. New Mexico Retiree Health Care Authority follows many federal and state regulations related to health data privacy, such as the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act (HIPAA). NMRHCA conducts an annual HIPAA training for all our customer service and staff, which includes information an training throughout the year. Information is sent to our data warehouse for reporting, which maintains strict encryption and security firewalls to protect it. Access to this claims data is extremely limited to ensure additional privacy and security.

## ADMINISTRATIVE IMPLICATIONS

Current policies and procedures may require updates to systems and administration of private information. Strict guidelines are currently in placed due to the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act, which requires the agency to follow electronic data interchange procedures and maintain the privacy and security of all electronic, written or oral information.
