## **BILL SUMMARY**

<u>Synopsis:</u> HB 463 creates the "Perinatal Investigation and Support Unit" within the Children, Youth and Families Department (CYFD) as a two-year pilot program to investigate and assess all reports of substance-exposed newborns from health care providers statewide made pursuant to the requirements of Section 32A-4-3(A) NMSA 1978.

## FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

There will be a minimal administrative cost for statewide update, distribution and documentation of statutory changes. Any additional fiscal impact on the judiciary would be proportional to the enforcement of this law and any increase in the number of petitions alleging neglect or abuse being filed. New laws, amendments to existing laws and new hearings have the potential to increase caseloads in the courts, thus requiring additional resources to handle the increase.

## SIGNIFICANT ISSUES

1) The American Academy of Pediatrics (AAP) notes that the *ICD-9-CM Official Guidelines for coding and Reporting* states that, "For coding and reporting purposes the perinatal period is defined as before birth through the 28th day following birth." This means that the perinatal period continues through the 28th day of life, ending on the 29th calendar day after birth because the day of birth is considered day 0. Because the day of birth equals day 0, the day *after* birth is considered day 1." *Clarification: Perinatal Period Definition*, AAP Pediatric Coding Newsletter, December 2011, https://publications.aap.org/codingnews/article-

In contrast, the World Health Organization (WHO) describes the perinatal period as spanning from 22 completed weeks of gestation and ends 7 completed days after birth. *Perinatal conditions*, World Health Organization,

and others define the perinatal period as including the whole duration of pregnancy and the first 4 weeks or up to the first year postpartum. HB 463 does not provide a definition for "perinatal".
