SECTION III: NARRATIVE

BILL SUMMARY

Synopsis:

House Bill 513 (HB 513) Organ Donor Public Assistance and Registry requires a space on license applications and license renewal forms and application forms for public assistance benefits and services for applicants to state a desire to make an anatomical gift. HB 513 requires the affidavit to be sent to Motor Vehicle Division (MVD) of Taxation and Revenue Department to maintain the completed statements in a statewide donor registry. HB 513 has an effective date of January 1, 2026.

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

HB 513 does not make any appropriations. To implement the necessary changes, the Health Care Authority (HCA) will require funds. Nonrecurring costs to make system enhancement to allow for HCA to send the affidavit to MVD electronically to add the individual to the Organ Donor Registry. Also, along with the electronic process to send the affidavit, the affidavit will need to be attached to paper and online applications. The HCA is required to have applications readily available in Spanish, Simplified Chinese, and Vietnamese language the affidavit will need to be translated in the above said languages. These activities have one-time cost of \$5,046.2. To maintain the electronic process to send affidavit to MVD there will be a recurring cost of \$81.0.

SIGNIFICANT ISSUES

HB 513 has an effective date of January 1, 2026. NMHCA would need to secure funding to implement by the effective date.

PERFORMANCE IMPLICATIONS

Training on proper completion and witness signature of the donor statement will need to be provided to all ISD eligibility staff. No significant issues to timely completion of applications.

ADMINISTRATIVE IMPLICATION

As noted in the fiscal implications section of the analysis, HB513 will require IT system changes to the ASPEN eligibility system and the UP. These changes include updates to the application for benefits, screen updates, correspondence updates and language changes in Income Support Division (ISD) and Medical Assistance Division (MAD) forms, Electronic Document Management (EDM) changes, electronic sharing of donor information with the Motor Vehicle Division (MVD), and updates to internal reports and dashboards. The work cannot begin until after July 1, 2025 and would take approximately 63 weeks to complete. HCA would not have this implemented by January 1, 2026.

TECHNICAL ISSUES

Addition of the required statement requires a change to online applications for new and renewal applications. An Application Programming Interface (API) to transfer the data to the MVD will be required to reduce any manual efforts.

OTHER SUBSTANTIVE ISSUES

Attaching opt-ins for organ donation to applications for public assistance may set a costly, administratively burdensome precedent for future opt-ins on other questions, as well as unintentionally communicating to HCA customers that receiving benefits is contingent on the options presented.
