BILL SUMMARY

Synopsis:

House Bill 520 (HB 520) is creating The Sustain the Families trust fund for future issuance of subsidies for lower income residents for the purpose of assisting those in New Mexico who are most disadvantaged as a basic right.

HB 520 does not have any fiscal impacts to any of the Health Care Authority (HCA).

OTHER SUBSTANTIVE ISSUES

The HCA administers the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP), Cash Assistance, Medicaid and Low-Income Home Energy Assistance (LIHEAP) programs. These programs have federal and state requirements that require HCA to review income and resources when determining eligibility. HB 520 will provide income subsidies to lower income residents. HB 520 fails to identify how long the individual(s) will receive the subsidies, does not define what qualifies as lower income and does not state the amount or frequency of the subsidy. Without the exact information HCA is unable to definitely say that this will impact recipients of the public assistance, but it can be assumed that many that qualify for the subsidy are receiving benefits as well. This may impact the public assistance these residents receive.
