#### **BILL SUMMARY**

<u>Synopsis:</u> House Bill 534 (HB534) requires that Children, Youth, and Families (CYFD) contract with speech-language pathologists to provide training and workshops for families and case workers to help children in foster care develop language support and emotional development to share their stories.

#### FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

None for the HCA.

(Medicaid reimburses for direct speech-language therapy services when medically necessary but does not cover general training for caregivers or caseworkers, as proposed under HB 534.)

#### **SIGNIFICANT ISSUES**

Each year, there are between 2,000 – 2,6000 children are in the foster care system in New Mexico. Statistics — New Mexico Child First Network

Children who enter the foster care system are at increased risk for language delays, speech difficulty and early language development, due to adverse circumstances they may experience prior to adoption. These language and speech developmental delays greatly impact their communication skills.

Support provided by dedicated speech-language pathologists may help foster parents and caregivers to implement interventions that play a role in the prevention of delays or disorders in young foster children.
