SECTION III: NARRATIVE

BILL SUMMARY

<u>Synopsis:</u> House Bill 561 states that US Department of Labor housing standards apply to housing for migrant seasonal farmworkers.

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

The Department of Workforce Solutions currently enforces US Department of Labor housing standards for migrant seasonal farmworkers, and would not require additional funding unless the federal government reduces funding.

SIGNIFICANT ISSUES:

The US Department of Labor housing standards already apply to housing for migrant and seasonal farmworkers, so this bill is not needed. If the bill is intended to pre-empt local and state building codes, DWS does not believe it achieves this intent without specific pre-emption language.

PERFORMANCE IMPLICATIONS: None

ADMINISTRATIVE IMPLICATIONS: None.

CONFLICT, DUPLICATION, COMPANIONSHIP, RELATIONSHIP:

Local and state building codes and zoning codes may relate to this bill.

TECHNICAL ISSUES:

As stated before, the bill does not pre-empt local and state building and zoning codes as written. It is unclear if this is the intent.

OTHER SUBSTANTIVE ISSUES: None.

ALTERNATIVES:

The State could provide grants to employers of migrant and seasonal farmworkers to improve their housing and bring housing up to applicable federal, state and local standards.

WHAT WILL BE THE CONSEQUENCES OF NOT ENACTING THIS BILL:

Federal regulations that state that federal, state and local laws and regulations apply to MSFW housing would continue to apply.
