SECTION III: NARRATIVE

BILL SUMMARY

Makes appropriations to several entities including the Administrative Office of the Courts, New Mexico Health Care Authority, Corrections Department, Department of Public Safety, Department of Finance Administration and the University of New Mexico for initatives designed to improve public safety by addressing behavioral health related needs.

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

\$140,000,000 expenditure from the General Fund.

SIGNIFICANT ISSUES

New Mexico has a severe shortage of community-based behavioral health services which is taxing the public safety infrastructure of local and state government. Appropriations and proactive policy are needed to address the large holes in the state's safety net. This bill appears to be an effort to do that.

SB2 targets a wide range of agencies in the areas of public safety, housing support, homeless support, and court programs. Some funding is targeted at regional planning initatives around public safety and the courts.

The basis for determining the specific financial appropriations identified within the bill is unknown and it is not clear if the programs recommended were validated for efficacy relative to the desired outcomes.

Also unknown is the overall vision or plan that provides the impetus for this bill. Is there an overarching system plan that has been designed outlining how the funding in the bill will be utilized to support the desired system development?

PERFORMANCE IMPLICATIONS

There are no specific performance measures listed in the bill to determine if objectives are being met.

ADMINISTRATIVE IMPLICATIONS

Entities receiving funding would need to develop administrative oversight systems to assure the funding is being utilized as intended under the bill.
