# **SECTION III: NARRATIVE**

#### **BILL SUMMARY**

## Synopsis:

Under the current Fostering Connections Act, those who turn eighteen while in CYFD's custody without being adjudicated are not eligible for the extended foster care program. Additionally, those who turn eighteen while in state custody under a Voluntary Placement Agreement are not eligible.

This bill expands eligibility for extended foster care services to include these young people.

#### FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

There is no appropriation contained within this bill.

This legislation may result in a slight increase in the number of Extended Foster Care Petitions filed (anticipated at less than 10 per year) and the corresponding need to appoint counsel by the Office of Family Representation and Advocacy (OFRA) to represent these eligible adults. The financial implication for OFRA is negligible and we can absorb the cost of representation within our budget.

# WHAT WILL BE THE CONSEQUENCES OF NOT ENACTING THIS BILL

If this Bill is not enacted, certain youth would continue to be ineligible for the Fostering Connections program unless the current Executive Order remains in effect long-term. The youth excluded include: youth who turn 18 before an adjudication in an abuse or neglect case or an action for families in need of court-ordered services, and youth who emancipate from department custody while the subject of a voluntary placement agreement.
