SECTION III: NARRATIVE

BILL SUMMARY:

This bill authorizes the Public Education Department to enter into state-tribal education compacts with Nations, Pueblos, or Tribes to establish language and culture-based schools. The bill outlines the application process, operational requirements, and rulemaking authority for these schools. The bill exempts tribal compact schools from certain state regulations, mandates reporting requirements, except those made applicable pursuant to the provisions of the State Tribal Education Compact Schools Act and in the state-tribal education compact. The bill allows state-tribal compact schools to receive state and federal funding. It also permits employment preferences and admissions prioritization. Additionally, this bill amends the Public School Capital Outlay Act to include said schools.

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

This bill does not contain an appropriation.

While IAD does not directly work in education, IAD does work closely with its sister agencies and it could require that IAD have additional FTE on staff of assist the Public Education Department, particularly the Indian Education Division, to meet some of the requirements of the bill.

SIGNIFICANT ISSUES

The bill supports tribal sovereignty and self-determination through allowing Nations, Pueblos, and Tribes more extensive autonomy over the curriculum and evaluation of such curriculum. Additionally, the bill requires a government-to-government relationship between the state and Nations, Pueblos, and Tribes regarding education as it impacts Native American students. Tribal communities are most familiar with their language and culture and can provide an appropriate avenue to create language and culture schools.

IAD defers to PED regarding any implications which may arise due to exemptions from certain state statutes or requirements.
