SECTION III: NARRATIVE

BILL SUMMARY

Synopsis: Creating the Wildfire Prepared Act at the Energy Minerals and Natural Resources Department, while also amending and recompiling a section of the NMSA 1978. Senate Bill 33 creates a Fire Planning Task Force and creates and wildfire prepared program and fund.

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

Section 3, Subsection A, Item 2 prescribes the director of the local government division of the department of finance and administration as a member of the fire planning task force. The members of the task force, as prescribed in Item C of Section 3 allows members of the task force to receive per diem and mileage as needed to accommodate the duties required of the task force set forth in Item E of Section 3.

SIGNIFICANT ISSUES

Section 3, Subsection E, Item 5 prescribes the following:

(5) develop by June 30 of each year guidelines and requirements for eligibility for grants consistent with the provisions of and provided through the wildfire prepared program pursuant to Section 4 of the Wildfire Prepared Act;

Grant funding can fall under various timelines as it relates to the original source of funds. For example, grants passed through legislative session of the same year may become available immediately after signature (April-May), in which case the prior year guidelines may not coincide with the latest administrative requirements possibly prescribed in legislative language. Moreover, federal funds typically become available after October 1st, but may be subject to calendar or fiscal year requirements for the department providing the funding.
