SECTION III: NARRATIVE

BILL SUMMARY

Synopsis: The bill amends Section 30-3-8 NMSA 1978 to distinguish between shooting at a motor vehicle and shooting from a motor vehicle, making them separate crimes with specific penalties. It also outlines the penalties for shooting at a dwelling or occupied building. The bill includes provisions for the seizure and forfeiture of motor vehicles used in these crimes, mandates the revocation of driver's licenses for those convicted, and specifies that such offenses are considered violent felonies under the Criminal Sentencing Act. Additionally, it amends Section 66-5-29 NMSA 1978 to ensure mandatory revocation of licenses for these offenses.

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

None. Does not change the penalties or makes a new crime.

WHAT WILL BE THE CONSEQUENCES OF NOT ENACTING THIS BILL

Addresses the increase in drive by shootings in New Mexico. Lowers the standard mens rea standard on shooting at a motor vehicle to a reckless disregard standard.
